### Significant Incidents


*Tuesday, June 21, 2016, at 6:46 AM*: Sedona Fire District (SFD) crews responded to a reported dryer fire at Kachina Point Rehabilitation Hospital, 505 Jacks Canyon Road in the Village of Oak Creek. On arrival, crews found the fire was located within a commercial dryer. The fire was out on arrival and contained to the interior of the dryer. The cause of the fire is under investigation.

*Tuesday, June 28, 2016, at 9:53 AM:* SFD crews responded to a reported vehicle trailer fire at the 3700 block of West State Route 89A. Crews found an open trailer containing landscape vegetation on fire and quickly extinguished the fire.

## Community Risk Management

In June 2016, SFD had 146 Inspections, Plan Reviews, and Consultations compared to 140 in June 2015 – an increase of 4%. YTD: 2016 – 774 and in 2015 – 642 an increase of 21%. *Note*: The Fire Inspector position is currently vacant. Firefighter Rick Evans is assigned to assist with inspections.

Inspection of temporary use permits: YTD: 2016 – 97 compared to 67 in YTD 2015 –an increase of 56% over 2015.

Significant New Construction Projects:

- Plans have been submitted for OneAZ Credit Union at the new Nexus Building, 20 Roadrunner Drive, located next to the Sedona City Hall.
- Plans have been approved for a pre-fabricated bridge and free standing elevator adjacent to Wayside Chapel in Uptown Sedona. This construction will improve access from the public parking lot to Uptown shopping area.

## Training Information – June 2016

The Training Office gathers information on post-secondary education, certificates of completion, and major conferences. SFD provides daily drills and other training; more significant events are included here.

#### **Required Training:**

- Payroll & Benefits Specialist Keona Freeman attended a class on "Know Human Resources Best Practices to Ensure Employer Compliance and Mitigate Potential Liabilities".
- Training Officer Michael Duran and Captain Mark Rippy completed the Training Officer Credential program though International Society of Fire Service Instructors (ISFSI). ISFSI credential designation provides instructors a pathway to develop and advance as professional educators and bridge the gap between fire service professional development, credentialing of instructors, and accreditation of emerging training curriculums, eLearning platforms, and programs. This class was a pilot program; there was no cost associated with the class.
- Division Chief Ed Mezulis instructed all operational members on the Verde Valley Medical Pre-hospital Care Department updates for 2016.

#### **Conference:**

Battalion Chief Dave Cochrane attended the Hazard Zone Conference – Blue Card. This class keeps instructors up to date on current Blue Card curriculum. The cost of this class was offset by a new membership to Blue Card.

#### Associates/Bachelor's Degrees:

> Firefighter Jonathan King earned his Bachelor degree in Interdisciplinary Studies - Emergency Management.

#### **Certificates:**

- Captain Jordan Baker and Engineer Jarret Tarver completed Functional Movement System to help make members more agile and reduce injury; using an integrated system incorporating firefighter-specific movement training with nutrition and recovery strategies, firefighters prepare for the daily physical stresses of duty, while decreasing potential for injury.
- Firewise Assessor Course was held at SFD; this is designed for fire professionals, community members, and home owner associations to become certified to assess and evaluate properties in Firewise. Additionally, Engineer Sean Chartier and Firefighter Todd Miranda completed the course, which will train individuals in wildfire ecology, property assessment, and fire hazard mitigation tactics for property owners. This course was instructed and funded by Arizona State Forestry.
