Significant Incidents


May 2016: SFD crews responded to multiple appliance-related fires throughout the month. On arrival, emergency crews found residences filled with smoke. In each case, crews assisted the residents in removing smoke and securing the electrical power to the appliance.

Wednesday, May 25, 2016, at 9:16 AM: SFD crews responded to a reported vehicle fire on Broken Arrow Trail off SR 179. When crews arrived at the trailhead, 2 firefighters hiked in approximately 400 yards to find a jeep on top of Princess Rock. The fire was out on arrival, but SFD personnel assisted the owner by helping push the jeep down to the road.

Community Risk Management

In May 2016, SFD had 145 Inspections, Plan Reviews, and Consultations compared to 76 in May 2015 – an increase of 90%. YTD: 2016 – 616 and in 2015 – 501, an increase of 21%. *Note*: The Fire Inspector position is currently vacant. Firefighter Rick Evans is assigned to assist with inspections.

Significant New Construction Projects:

- Three of the four businesses at Tlaquepaque North, 313 State Route 179, have opened for business. They include a causal restaurant, kitchenware shop, and a clothing store.
- ➤ The remodel of Whole Foods Market at 1420 West State Route 89A is near completion.

Training Information – May 2016

The Training Office gathers information on post-secondary education, certificates of completion, and major conferences. SFD provides daily drills and other training; more significant events are included here.

Required Training:

- > Operational members attended a Structural Firefighting "Hot" drill at the Verde Valley Training Center to meet SFD mandates and NFPA 1403. The scope was to utilize SFD Tactics and Standard Operating Principles, integrate Blue Card Hazard Zone Size-up, SLICE-RS, Modern Fire Behavior, and UL NIST Studies. The purpose was to provide a consistent approach to structural firefighting making it safer for the public and firefighters.
- Division Chief Ed Mezulis, working with Verde Valley Medical Center, coordinated a Skills Lab in Cottonwood to advance the medical skills of all our members.
- ➤ Captain Angel Morales attended Keying and Hardware Training to support facilities in controlling access and security for all doors in SFD.
- ➤ Chief Kris Kazian attended the Gold Medal Firefighter Safety Summit, which covered innovative solutions for firefighter safety.
- > Firefighter Jon Scaife attended Rescue 3 Certification Class for Swiftwater Rescue.
- > The Verde Valley Training Association hosted a Wildland drill in Cottonwood. Attendees came from 15 surrounding agencies and included over 100 members. The exercise was an initial attack on a wildfire with a mutual aid response.
- ➤ DPS, working with SFD, conducted a Helicopter Rescue Team recertification training, with a portion of the class held at the tower at Station 3 for annual repel device training.
- > SFD participated in the PFAC Drill in Flagstaff, as part of a mutual aid response to a wildland fire.
- > IT Lead Technician Jeremy Harris instructed members on the new audio-visual equipment in the Multipurpose Room at Station 1. Additionally, Jeremy upgraded the new SharePoint for our internal web service.

Certificates:

➤ Marc Howard has completed an Instrument Pilot Helicopter Course on Quantum Helicopters which was funded by the Federal government.
